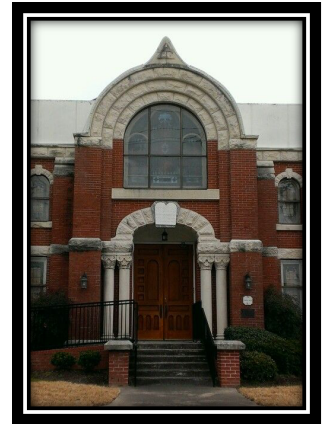

Message from the Rabbi

Shalom,

As Americans, we love a good countdown. Every New Year's Eve we count down as the ball drops in New York City atop One Times Square. At this time of year, probably every school-age kid is, with great anticipation, counting down the days until summer break. And now that I'm a Houstonian, I have a special appreciation for NASA's countdowns before launching rockets, satellites, or probes into outer space.

As Jews, we don't typically count down. Rather, we count up! Consider, for example, the days of the week. In Hebrew, Sunday is *Yom Rishon*, the 1st day; Monday is *Yom Sheini*, the 2nd day, etc. We count up, until we reach the highpoint of the week: Shabbat, the 7th day. We count the Hebrew months in a similar manner. Passover occurs in the 1st month; Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur, and Sukkot are in the 7th month. We also count up the days of Chanukah, lighting one candle on the first night and adding an additional candle on the successive nights as a symbol of our joy increasing.

And now, we are currently engaged in the greatest count up of the Jewish year: the counting of the Omer. Starting on the second night of Passover we count the days nightly for 7 weeks of 7 days, until on the 50th day we arrive at the Festival of Shavuot. On Shavuot we celebrate God giving the gift of Torah to the people Israel – *Z'man Matan Torah*. Yet the connection between Passover and Shavuot is more than a matter of counting days. We were not freed from Egypt to simply be a free people; we were freed from Egypt so that we could have the liberty to follow God's commandments. When we count the Omer, we count up with anticipation because we know that at the end of the 7-week period we will receive the gift of Torah.

The period of counting of the Omer is more than a daily numeration of days. For our biblical ancestors, it marked the passage of time between the early spring harvest and the barley harvest. For us, it is a time for growth and self-improvement, a reminder, as we count each day, to make each day count. One of the reasons the giving of Torah came 7 weeks after the Exodus was so that our ancestors had time to prepare themselves mentally, physically, and spiritually. Likewise, as we count the Omer, we also consider ways



to better ourselves. Each night, we should take time to reflect on the day past, then consider how to make the next day count even more.

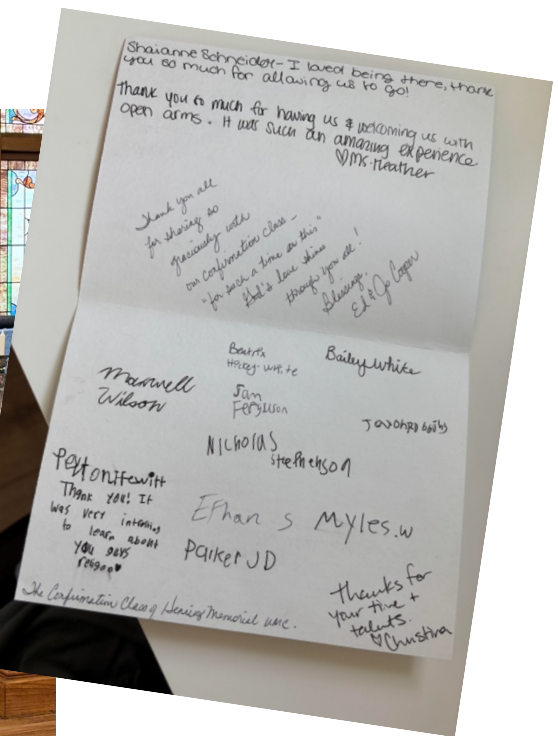
